<b>Whakatapoko</b> Eg - He whare whakatapoko - an accessible building	Access Accessible, Accessibility
<b>Wharepaku Whaikaha</b>	Disabled Toilet
<b>Wharepaku Whakatapoko</b>	Accessible Toilet
